

University-Level Issues in GE Implementation (Updated Nov. 2014)

Components:

- Eligibility
- Grandfathering chart (2 year transition for current students)
- Prereqs for Advanced GE
- Categories of requirements and courses for GE 2 (Breadth classes)
- Associate's degree with new GE requirements
- Timeline for implementation and piloting
- Shift in process: Approval of GE subs by GE chair, separate issue than sub/equiv for majors

Eligibility for GE Programs

Current GE 2014 – all students who start UG classes before Fall 2015 may use as default

Transition GE 2015 – all students who start UG classes before Fall 2015 may opt to switch over

New GE Fall 2015 – required of all students who start UG classes in Fall 2015

Grandfathering Chart

Will apply both during the pilot phase and for continuing students when the new program starts

In addition to using these equivalencies for finishing up the old GE program, these equivalencies will also apply for *continuing* students who wish to graduate on the New GE Program. New freshmen who start on the new GE program starting Fall 2015 will not be able to use these equivalences.

Prerequisites for Advanced GE (Transition options to be programmed in PS for next year or two)

World Communities – (ENGL 101 + GE 100/HIST 201 + GE 110/ENGL 201) and Jr. Status (60 credits)

Advanced Writing – (ENGL 101 + GE 110/ENGL 201 + GE 110/ENGL 201) and Jr. Status (60 credits)

Category-neutral, major-neutral >> no impact if change majors or challenges to track differently

Associate's degree with new GE requirements

Our UG AAS/ASBM: Have all those who start an associate's degree after the new GE program begins use the new GE components for completion of the Associate's degree. All who had previously begun would be grandfathered in just as any bachelor's degree student.

Our Online associate's degree: could have the same transition or could be different and keep old GE if all the classes are not available online. Or a modification could be made for a class like LOC COM that might not be offered online. **[PROPOSED UNIVERSAL GE will meet both transition and online issues]**

Transfer Associate Degrees:

Associate's degrees (AAS, AGS, AS, AA, ALS) from accredited colleges and Universities to be accepted to complete GE, with the additional course work of [ENG 315/Adv. Writing] AND Local Communities

Associate's degrees of Applied Science AND 2 year Diplomas would have a standardized reduced program of: GE 100, GE 110, GE 120, Eng 315, World Comm = 15 hours
